Welcome to the 23-24 sailing season. We have an extensive sailing and social calendar ready for members to participate at all levels. Once again, we have sail training and sailing discovery activities ready to improve skills or just offer a taste of sailing.

The hard work displayed in two recent working bees means the yard is ready. It is now time for sailors to open up the sail boxes, clear out the spiders, and be reminded of what was left broken at the end of last season.

Thanks to the financial commitment of the members at our Special General Meeting in January this year, extensive repairs have been made to the lower section of the ramp, ensuring our valuable asset will continue to serve us long into the future.

Over the next year, we will continue to work on maintaining the upper section of the ramp – some work is required on several piers, but it is not expected that we need to carry out replacement of the top deck this year.

At our opening weekend in November, I reflected on the history of yacht clubs and how - prior to VHF radios and mobile phones — flags were used to communicate. The club flag or "burgee" identifies a vessel as belonging to a particular club. It is a nautical tradition to exchange burgees when visiting other boat clubs/yacht clubs or entering into reciprocity agreements.

I showed logos of Apple, Tesla, and "Island Surfboards." They all make us think of a product and are a positive image for the community that chooses these products. What does our club burgee mean to you? If it makes you feel anything other than a sign of a growing, dynamic club meeting the needs of the members, then maybe we have some work to do.

If we want to change anything, first we need to measure — and the committee is preparing a member's survey to ask and understand the needs of the members. This will be launched at the end of December. I urge all members to participate in filling out the survey. This will help the committee understand the expectations of members and highlight the areas we need to improve.

Australia's toughest Catamaran Challenge

Cowes Yacht Club will be running the 28th edition of arguably one of Australia's toughest off the beach sailing endurance races this March, the Australian Air Safaris Around French Island National Catamaran Challenge.

Yes you read that right, for 2024 the event has been given National status by Australian Sailing. This is a huge step forward and an amazing achievement for CYC to now own a nationally recognised event, this is something that all members should be very proud of.

The Around French Island Committee made up of Tim Modra, Ian Hart, Brian Walton, David Arnold and Andrew Janson have been working ever since the 2023 event finished to make sure the race and the event day continues to grow year on year. The hard work that Doug Telford did in 2022 & Ian Hart in 2023 has set the event in the right direction, with early plans suggesting 2024 will go to a new level.

The event's recent godfather and visionary Tony Kirkhope will continue to support the event as major naming rights partner and fund the prize money (which we have increased for 2024) via his Australian Air Safaris business. The AFI Committee and wider

Cowes Yacht Club Members would love to thank him for this continued support.

The Isle of Wight Hotel will also be returning as a major partner with a huge focus on the race day event and community engagement with some really exciting things to announce as part of this as a later stage.

And last but certainly not least the AFI Committee would like to announce that we have locked in the final major partner position by welcoming Modra Technology to the 2024 event.

One of the ways that the Modra Technology sponsorship will be used is that we will be offering a fuel rebate to interstate competitors. This should help encourage keen sailors to cross the borders and come to the race. So thank you to Tim & Jeni Modra and their business Modra Technology for their support of the 2024 event.

The AFI Committee are well aware that this one day requires significant work from a lot of people and we are thankful for all those that step in to help. We are working very hard to minimise the workload on the Members pre-event and on the event weekend. It should be noted that this single day event brought in over \$10k profit in 2023 as well as a \$5k capital expenditure investment into the Club. We are confident that the event will grow in 2024 with both participation numbers and event profit so the hard work is well worth it.

There are some really exciting things happening with plenty more plans in the pipeline. One such example is welcoming the Wildlife Coast Cruises (the team behind the Kasey Lee) on as an event partner who will be supplying a ferry for members and the public to watch the race start, details on this to come.

The Victorian Government will be sponsoring the event in 2024 as part of their significant events program to help support safety and engage interstate competitors.

To have the Victoria Government supporting us is another huge sign of the continued growth this event is attracting.

Australian Air Safaris, Isle of Wight Hotel, Modra Technology, the Victorian Government & Wildlife Coast Cruises are then joined by some much loved and huge supporters of CYC for many years in Westernport Water, Bendigo Bank & the Phillip Island RSL.

All major sponsor positions are now full for the 2024 event which is a fantastic result for the event and the Club. The sign on sheet has a safety and insurance declaration – if you don't have insurance your race results will not be recognised! A reminder that it is the responsibility of those with boats in the yard to keep the grass mown under your boat. The mower is next to the tractor – be sure to wear appropriate footwear!

Flares



Out of date flares must not be left at the club! You can dispose of them at some police stations. New Victorian boating laws introduced in June 2023 mean that 25W VHF radio or EPIRB may be an alternative to carrying flares.

Sailing and Training

Hi all,

As the sailing season is under underway – you'll notice our sign in sheets ask for you to verify that you have racing insurance & have a safety declaration. If you are racing an Off the beach (OTB) or a TY under 5.2 m, please see the OTB safety compliance declaration form & for Keel boats & larger TYs – see OTB safety compliance declaration form. You can either print the form out & hand to Michael Hart or Katie Holroyd or Lyn Milner or you can fill in electronically & email to sailing@cowesyachtclub.com. Form is not required for club boats.

A copy of your insurance certificate can be uploaded to your CYC account by logging in, Click "account" (in top righthand corner for PC, 3 lines on top lefthand corner for mobile) & editing your profile. Racing insurance is required by all boats & most companies allow you to buy 3rd party & racing insurance only. My trick is to set my excess to the cost of my boat to keep the price of insurance down/only pay for the minimum required. Particularly useful for older boats where the value of boat is low.

Please note – all participants in races (including crew) must have an active Australian Sailing number linked to Cowes Yacht Club – if you have any visitors – please buy them a SailPass via this link: https://www.cowesyachtclub.com/SailPass this ensures they are covered by Australia Sailing insurance & is mandatory rule of being an Australian Sailing club.

It is also a good time to check your details are correct such as email, address & phone numbers (including emergency contacts). Please see Website help">About->Website help for how to.

If any of your children (23 & under) or partners are missing from your account – please use the

following form to notify us of missing information & we can update their details & link them to your account (select "Club member updating details"). https://www.cowesyachtclub.com/events/184699/
Please note we do need birth dates as this is what is used to help you reset your own password or find/add your account and ensure you are paying the right fee for your age. This form is also used for new membership inquiries & therefore does have a lot of information about our membership process — ignore for your purposes con unless you want to upgrade your membership.

From then on, we had a beautiful light breeze – not enough to ruffle the water, but enough to fill the sails and give us a sail up north to Elizabeth Island and beyond. We almost went as far as Sandy Spit. We remembered a Cowes Yacht Club overnight trip there – James' and my last trip on Blazé, the Blazer 23, and the Mitchells on Banyandana. I remember that we all defied David Pearson's instructions to go somewhere else to stay than Sandy Spit and all ended up on the beach that night.

On our picnic with the Mitchells we passed the 'washing machine' which was very benign that day, compared with the return journey of the Wilkinsons from the overnight stay at Sandy Spit – the washing machine was on full spin that day.

We ate, we chatted and finally returned home to Newhaven, having had a very happy day on the water.
